

LICENSING OF INDOOR PUBLIC SPORTS ENTERTAINMENT

STANDARD CONDITIONS

1. The holder of a licence must notify the Chief Solicitor, in writing, not less than twenty-eight days before any event, of the organiser of the event, should he/she not be the licenceholder.
2. All recommendations of the Scottish Fire and Rescue Service, which are appended to these conditions, must be complied with.
3. The health and Safety at Work Etc. Act 1974, and all other relevant legislation in connection thereto must be complied with.
4. The licenceholder shall, where applicable, comply with the provisions of the Food Hygiene (Scotland) Regulations 1859 - 1978.
5. The licenceholder shall be responsible for ensuring that all activities carried out under the licence are conducted in a peaceful and orderly manner and in such a way as not to cause annoyance, nuisance or damage to any neighbouring occupiers or otherwise constitute an noise nuisance in terms of the Control of Pollution Act 1974.
6. Adequate first aid facilities and equipment, appropriate to the risk, should be provided and their location suitably identified throughout the premises.
7. For swimming pool premises, where the spectators' seating area is not separate from the poolside, protective matting should be provided around the poolside during times of high usage to prevent contamination from outdoor footwear to bathers and the pool water.
8. Any Fire Officer, Police Constable or authorised Officer of the Council shall be permitted free access to the whole of the premises at any time and all reasonable directions and requirements of such officers or the Council must be complied with.
