
How We Recycle GLASS Bottles and Jars





don't use bottle banks at night as that might disturb people living nearby.

The recycled glass is now called cullet and is taken to a glass bottle making factory. It is heated in a furnace at a temperature of 1500°C. Molten glass is then drawn from the furnace, cut into pieces called gobs, dropped into a mould and blown into the shape of a bottle or jar. All by complex machines, controlled by computers.

At the glass treatment centre all the bottles and jars are crushed. Then magnets, giant vacuum cleaners and even lasers go over

the glass to extract metal, ceramics and light materials like paper and plastics. Pieces of metal, plastics and stones can spoil the recipe for glass - so they must be removed.

When around 20 tonnes of glass have been collected - that's 60,000 bottles - lorries take the glass to the nearest glass treatment centre.
