Description of the Plan:	 The SG 'Planning and Noise' is aimed at helping to prevent and limit the adverse effects of noise. It applies to where new noise sensitive developments are proposed near to existing noise sources and where potentially noisy developments are introduced into existing noise sensitive areas. The SG provides guidance on undertaking noise impact assessments (NIA) which may be required for any potential development in determining planning applications. The SG will cover the administrative geographical boundaries of West Lothian Council. When adopted the guidance will be a material consideration in the determination of planning applications.

'There is a presumption against developments that are: a. likely to generate significant amounts of noise being located close to noise sensitive developments such as existing or proposed housing; or b. residential or other noise sensitive developments being close to noisy land use. The only exceptions will be where it can be demonstrated that: a. through design or mitigation, satisfactory internal and external noise levels can be achieved at the noise sensitive development; and b. through design or mitigation, there will be no adverse impact on the continued operation of any existing or proposed business or activity. The terms of the council's Supplementary Guidance on Noise will apply.'
