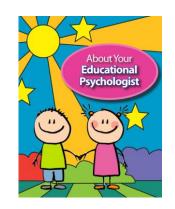


WLEPS Values

Our Service Improvement Priorities (2025-26)

Develop supports and build capacity in mental health practice and approaches

We will:

- Continue to support professional learning for Give us a Break, trauma-informed and EBSNA practice.
- Contribute to GIRFEC practice with updated guidance on pupil voice in the child's planning process.
- Support the authority level Nurture initiative

Develop Assessment and planning in the Early Years

We will:

- Collaborate with the Central ESS team and partner agencies to build capacity within the Early Years to promote inclusive practice
- Further refine EP assessment tools to inform the ELC-P1 transition process
- Examine existing data & conduct research to inform the assessment, transition and decision-making processes

Care Experienced Children and Young People

We will:

- Establish stronger links with social policy mangers to support more robust joint planning for CECYP
- Embed EP guidance for supporting young people outwith the authority
- Develop guidance for schools to support CECYP (including informal kinships) at key transitions
- Support implementation of The Promise Bill

Whole Team Development Work

- Continued development of our understanding and approach to Building Racial Literacy
- Engagement with the National Self-Evaluation programme for EPSs
- Engagement with WLAM programme to support improvements

Success will be when:

Nurture intervention support across identified schools CLPL for key staff on anxiety and EBSA available and embedded

GIRFEC updates provided for all schools in collaboration with central ESS EY process embedded and supported through ongoing evaluation

CECYP practice embedded across EP service and joint working with social work enhanced National Selfevaluation programme
