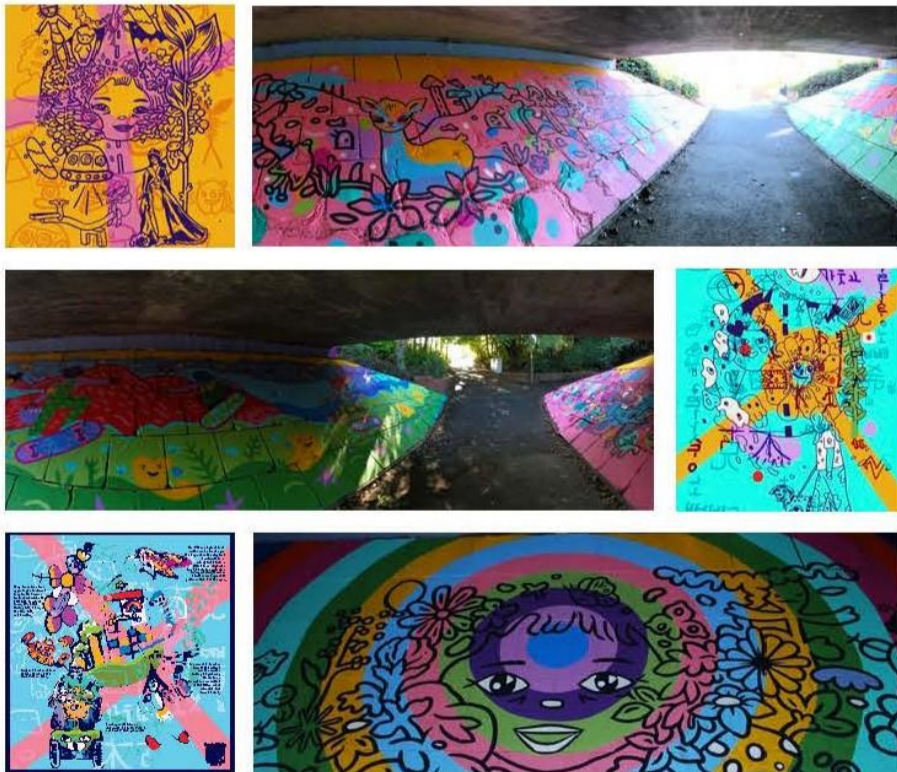

Livingston is a town of few pavements or pedestrian crossings. The town was built with off road pedestrian walkways and underpasses crossing under roads. Thanks to an idea from a member of Carmondean Community Council the underpasses in Carmondean have been refurbished and now turned into sites for new and brightly painted artworks. Several bus shelters have also been given an artistic upgrade.

This leaflet contains a map of the new art installations. Begin at the Elim Church (Oasis Centre), follow the paths around Carmondean's new outdoor gallery and end your journey at Carmondean Underpass. Or be really adventurous and walk the trail in the opposite direction.

1 Nether Dechmont Farm Underpass, under Knightsridge West Road, close to Carmondean Primary School  Bus Shelters



The mural on the path from Elim Church (Oasis Centre) heading to Jones Green and Jacklin Green gives a closer contemporary recreational view, looking at skate park and nature. Wildlife on nearby Deer Hill inspired these walls, the Five Sisters shale Bing becomes interpreted as five skateboarding sisters, alive and flying.

2 Deans Community High School Underpass, under Deans North Road, beside Netherwood Park  Bus Shelters



The mural beside DCHS is looking at nature and people's enjoyment and work with nature and with local history. Adventures in Dechmont Law Woods, enjoying woodlands creatively and finding fairy doors. Designs inspired from young people's contributions.

3 Harburn/Lenzie Avenue Underpass, under Carmondean Centre Road, opposite Pentland View Court

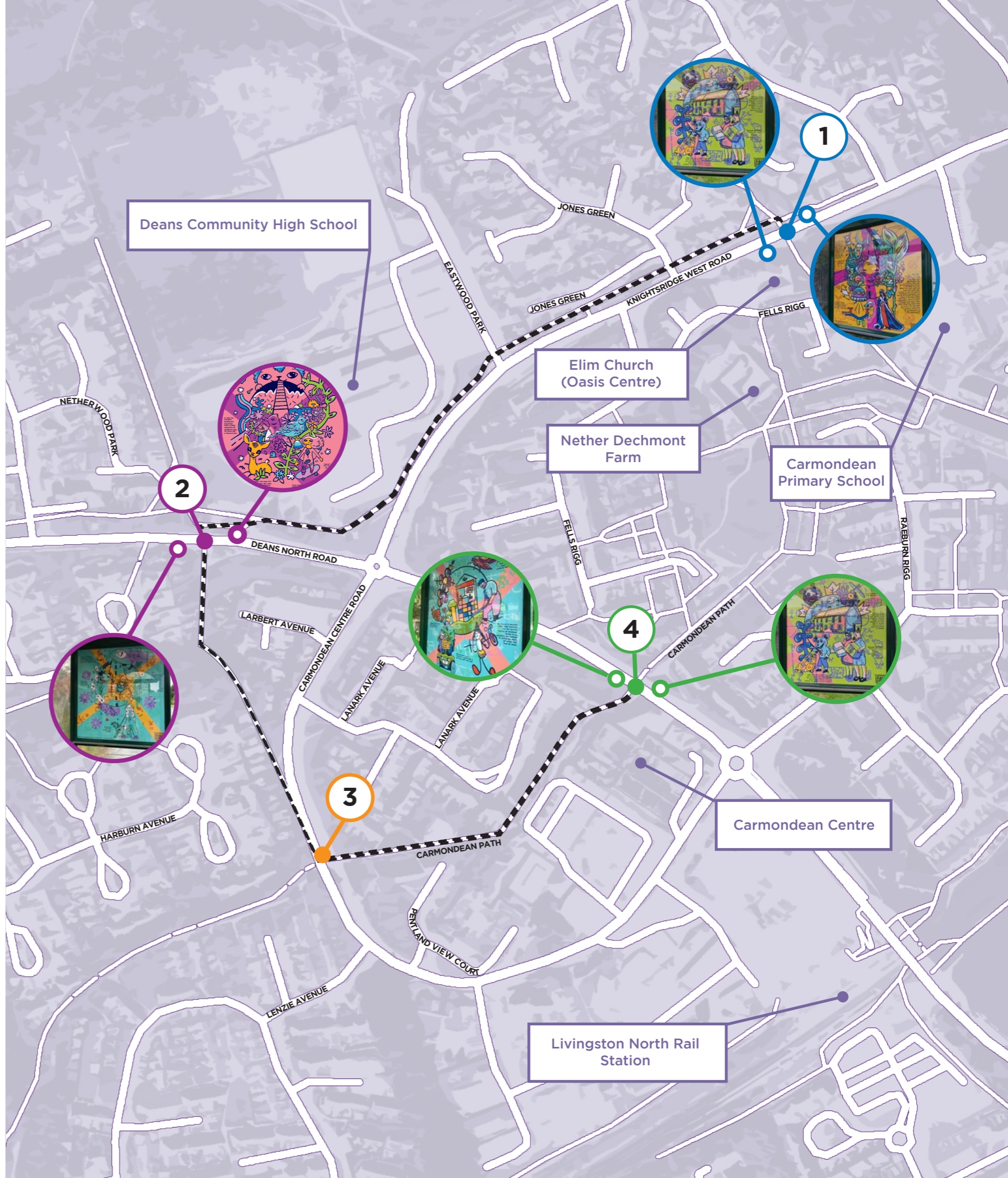


The mural between Carmondean Centre and Raeburn Rigg provides a local historical and personal voice to the art. Imagined UFO and aliens become represented in these works from local young people's contributions, alongside these David L Wilson's NORgate public sculpture is reimagined as walking roundabout characters.

4 Lanark Avenue Underpass, under Deans North Road, close to Carmondean Centre  Bus Shelters



The mural between Harburn/Lenzie Avenue leading to Carmondean Centre provides a historical and contemporary view, looking in a wider context at Livingston. The first LDC housing, memories and recognition of how far the town has come are reflected in this retro colour warp.
