Cost of Living: Product Safety Energy Saving Devices

Be careful of energy saving devices advertised online which promise to help you save on energy bills Many of these devices are highly dangerous and fail basic safety tests buy electrical products from trusted retailers rather than via online ads **#CostOfLivingScams**

Devices that claim to save users up to 40% of their energy bills are being sold via online marketplaces.

Electrical Safety First have tested several of these products and found that many are 'highly dangerous' and fail basic safety testing, potentially posing a fire or electric shock risk

Cost of Living: Product Safety Energy Saving Devices

Be careful of energy saving devices advertised online which promise to help you save on energy bills Many of these devices are highly dangerous and fail basic safety tests buy electrical products from trusted retailers rather than via online ads **#CostOfLivingScams**

In some cases, scammers are also cold calling vulnerable people and using the rising cost of living as a 'hook' to try and sell them these devices.

As well as being dangerous, the devices have been found to not provide any tangible energy savings.

Cost of Living: Product Safety Online Shopping




In the last year, over 4 million UK shoppers bought a fake electrical product

A quarter of these were purchased from an online marketplace.

Cost of Living: Product Safety Online Shopping




According to Electrical Safety First, 1 in 10 people in the UK have experienced an electric shock or fire after buying fake electrical products online.



A counterfeit may look the same as a genuine product on the outside but it's what's inside that counts.

These x-ray images from Electrical Safety First show the difference between real and counterfeit plugs



98% of counterfeit phone chargers tested by Electrical Safety First were extremely dangerous


In some cases, the pins were made with a lowquality metal which could snap off in the socket



These x-ray images from Electrical Safety First show the difference between real and counterfeit straighteners

In the fake straighteners, the wires lead straight from the mains to the hot plates, with nothing in between.

These x-ray images from Electrical Safety First show the difference between real and counterfeit blenders

The fake blender has no mechanism to stop the product from overheating and potentially going on fire.




If you're worried that an electrical product you have bought might be fake, don't use it

Where possible, buy from a retailer you trust, either direct from the manufacturer's website or a trusted High Street name



Online marketplaces are not subject to the same regulations as other retailers.

When shopping online, do some research before purchasing from sellers or companies you are not familiar with, particularly if they're selling branded goods at prices significantly lower than in official stores.


