



# ARMADALE LOCALITY PLAN

2023-2026

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### **Introduction**

The Community Empowerment (Scotland) Act 2015, requires Community Planning Partnerships (CPPs) to develop locality plans for specific areas experiencing poorer outcomes. In West Lothian, these areas have been identified through the Scottish Index of Multiple Deprivation (SIMD).

The plans aim to ensure that the Local Outcomes Improvement Plan (LOIP) is delivered meaningfully at a local level and that local issues identified by communities can influence CPP activity.

The Community Wealth Building Team manages the development and delivery of locality plans – creating a link between the LOIP, other key strategic partnership plans and structures, and the communities in West Lothian's most deprived areas.

This locality plan is one of six across West Lothian that aims to put the identified communities at the centre of its approach to tackling inequalities.

This plan has been developed against the backdrop of the cost of living crisis which is having a significant impact on local communities and their residents, coupled with a reduction in public finances. It is therefore even more important that partners work together at a local level to address the issues that communities are facing.

Priorities identified through engagement at a local level will be fed up to Community Planning partners and other key services. Services will also work with local communities to address issues identified through evidence and data.

The plan will provide a platform at a local level to deliver the key strategic themes of Community Wealth Building, as well as implementing the main mechanisms of the Community Empowerment Act such as community participation, participatory budgeting and community asset transfer.



# ::: Armadale - Local Context

Armadale is an ex-mining town and also known for its brick manufacturing. Its situated in the south west of West Lothian lying west of Bathgate and east of Blackridge.

Armadale is one of the five traditional towns in West Lothian with a population of 12,690 (2020 figure).

Armadale's townscape has several surviving buildings and structures which contribute to its history. 'The Goth' on West Main Street is one of the few remaining Gothenburgh style drinking establishments still run by a committee. A notable structure at Armadale cross is the Kerr Memorial. This honours Elizabeth Kerr a local

midwife who died over 100 years ago saving a child's life. To honour this selfless act, the community collected



money to pay for the erection of the memorial.

The social determinants of health in the diagram

to the left have a greater influence on our physical and mental health than health care systems, these need to be included when looking at reducing inequalities in our most deprived areas.

#### Scottish Index of Multiple Deprivation (SIMD) and other key data

Armadale has been identified as an area requiring a locality plan due to it containing data zones, or neighbourhoods, ranked in the bottom 20% in the SIMD.

The SIMD ranks data zones based on scores across the following seven domains:

- Income
- Employment
- Health
- Education/Skills
- Housing
- Geographic Access
- Crime

#### **FOODBANK VOUCHERS**

10,962 foodbank vouchers were distributed in West Lothian's wards in the financial year 2022/23. Of these, 1103 were distributed in Armadale and Blackridge.

About 6% of the West Lothian population were beneficiaries of the foodbank vouchers. In comparison, 13.5% of the child population of Armadale received help in the form of a food voucher.

#### LIFE EXPECTANCY

Areas of Armadale have much lower life expectancies than the rest of West Lothian. The life expectancy in West Lothian is 76.24 for males and 80.6 for females. The table below shows how much lower life expectancies are in these areas compared to the highest areas in West Lothian:

### **:::** Armadale - Local Context



#### Scottish Index of Multi Derivation (SIMD)

West Lothian has 35 data zones in the bottom two deciles of the SIMD, as shown here. Two are in Armadale as shown in the map.

#### Breaking down the SIMD data further:

**Armadale** - Two data zones are in the bottom 20% overall in Scotland with one of these being in the bottom 5% and is ranked 45 out of 6976.

Therefore, within Armadale there is a data zone that is one of the most deprived areas in Scotland.

All elements are made up of a range of factors. For example health is made up of alcohol, drugs. mortality, depression, low birth weight and emergency admissions to hospital.

#### **School Leaver Destination** Statistics 2022/23

16% of School leavers in Armadale moved onto Negative Destinations such as Unemployment (Seeking or not Seeking).

This is 6% higher than the West Lothian average of 10%

#### Children in Low Income Families 21/22

The average number of children in low income families in West Lothian is 19.9%. Within Armadale 3 data zones out of 22 are above the West Lothian average of 1 in 5 children living in low income families. The following three data zones are twice the West Lothian average:

- Armadale South (S01013395) 48.7%
- Armadale South (S01013394) 43.2 %
- Armadale South (S01013397) 39.7%

#### Alcohol-related Hospital Admissions 2021/22

The West Lothian average for hospital admissions is 516.5 per 100,000 population. The rates for Armadale are shown below:

- Blackridge, Westfield and Torphichen 681.6 per 100,000

## **::: Locality Planning Achievements to date**

This new locality plan follows on from a previous plan for Armadale that has been in place since in 2018.

A well established local steering group in the area, made up of key community organisations and partners, has helped to develop local structures and deliver the actions within the plan. Some achievements from the previous plan are shown below. Several of these areas of work will carry forward into the new action plan for 2023 - 2026.

#### **Town Centre Improvement Fund - WLC**

Armadale traditional town centre - £125,000 from 2018-19 to 2022-23.

#### **Town Centre Regeneration Funding**

£172,133 bid for and utilised locally on community projects

#### **Blackmoss improvements**

Significant investment has been made to the Blackmoss Nature Reserve which has seen path improvements making it more accessible for walking and wheeling.

New information boards were installed at each entrance and a new 'friends of group' has been established to promote positive usage of the site.

### Key Community Organisations Supported by West Lothian Council's Voluntary Organisations budget

Play Works Armadale supported the development and delivery of projects to the value £421,295 to support the local community. This has meant that services are delivered in the heart of the community where it is most needed. This has removed barriers for people living in the most deprived area (Mayfield) to access services.

#### **Partnerships**

Creation of a range of structures has enabled successful partnership working in Armadale.

These relationships work towards addressing the issues/ priorities in the community.

#### **Volunteer Park Improvements**

An all year floodlit 3G FIFA approved pitch has been installed at the Volunteer Park enabling football to played all year. Upgrades to the pavilions for both community use and team use has seen over 300 people train and coach at the venue each week.

Local businesses have reported a significant increase in footfall as a result of the improvements which will secure its future for 25 years.

#### **Safer Commuting Route**

Following an investment of **£1.2 million** a new shared offroad cycle and pedestrian path was created liking Armadale to Whitburn along the B8084.

This allows for safer commuting and reduced barriers for physical activity

#### **Specific Projects**

**Food projects** were established and supported in the area. These have developed and the number being provided have increased over the period with provision being provided from the Dale Hub, the Armadale Resource Centre and Armadale Partnership Centre.

A new resource centre aimed at supporting families and individuals locally was developed in 2022. Armadale Resource Centre houses a food bank, charity shop, various activities for all ages and a range of support services providing advice and assistance. The facility is in the middle of the town with easy access on foot and by public transport.

The newly named **Queen Elizabeth Square** was funded by the Town Centre Fund and was led by Armadale Community Council. It saw the old site of the war memorial turned into a lovely regenerated seating area with new benches, a new provost lamp and an information board depicting the time the late Queen Elizabeth II visited the same site in Armadale.

#### **Capacity Building**

The Community Wealth Building team has worked closely with several community groups, including Play Works Armadale, Armadale Resource Centre, Armadale Thistle FC and Armadale Shed to support the development of local projects and funding applications, liaising with a range of services to deliver projects throughout the process.

The team initiated the Aspiring West Lothian project that provided Play Works Armadale with £48,237 between 2017 and 2020, helping to transform them into key community organisations. The organisation was able to continue funding the worker on a full-time basis and is an integral element to all projects aimed at reducing inequalities.

# **Planning Structures**and Partners

In Armadale there is an established locality planning group called the Armadale Regeneration Group that involve local community organisations and community planning partners.

#### It allows for the following:

- sharing of information on service provision/ activities within the locality to help enhance current, and plan future, provision;
- identifying wider community needs from a services perspective;
- are a conduit for wider community engagement;
- developing collaborative working at local level; and
- working collaboratively to embed activity that aligns with community needs - where a local community led plan is established

Armadale Community Council are also a key partner in the above and are engaged in the development and delivery of the Armadale Locality Plan.



# **∷** Developing the Action Plan

In developing the actions within the plan, consideration has been given to data gathered from a range of sources.

This includes:

- the findings from recent community engagement carried out by the Community Wealth Building team and partner organisations;
- statistical information relevant to the local areas;
- mapping of key services and organisations that deliver activity in the areas; and
- linking to priorities within the LOIP and other key strategic documents and plans.

This is a live document which seeks to build on the actions from the previous plan, continuing to develop the provision, capacity and sustainability of partners in these communities, and taking an asset-based approach wherever possible.

The plan will help to empower communities and support organisations to bring external funding into the area.

# Local engagement and localised dataTools and approaches used

Various community engagement methods and tools have been utilised in the town to help determine the community's priorities. Additional engagement carried out by partners was also used to provide a clear picture of what matters to those who live, work and visit Armadale. Examples of approaches used include:



## **School engagement**

Specific engagement within local primary and secondary schools was carried out in the area. This allowed for the younger community to have their say on what they like about living in Armadale and what they don't.



They were given the opportunity to explore ideas to make the area better with some good discussion taking place on climate action at a local level.

This rich qualitative data has helped to determine the priorities for Armadale. This has enabled young people to have a voice in key decision making within the town.

When all the engagement materials were collated it provided a snap shot of what the community thought.









### **Identified Priorities**

Following intensive engagement, analysis of local data relevant to West Lothian and Scotland and feedback from services, the following key priorities have been identified as the focus in Armadale. All findings were presented to the relevant steering groups including Armadale Regeneration Group and Armadale Community Council to work on the actions within the plan.

Further community priorities, not aligned to data and service priorities will be addressed through this local plan and joint working locally.

#### Poverty, work and local economy

- Addressing the impacts of the cost of living through specific local projects
- Addressing economic inactivity, unemployment, underemployment and skills needs
- Addressing Child Poverty locally

#### **Health and Wellbeing**

- Reducing health inequalities focussing on the social determinants of health
- Addressing substance use locally
- Working to improve mental health within the community

#### **Environment**

- Addressing anti-social behaviour issues that arise
- Explore options for improvements to derelict areas
- Exploring green transport and community transport options
- Improve the look and vibrancy of the town centre

#### **Community Development**

- Building community capacity and supporting community organisations
- Improve communication channels between services and the community around key priorities
- Increase partnership working between all services and the community
